### Notes of meeting:

11:00	<p><b>1. Welcome</b></p> <p>Fiona warmly welcomed everyone to the second meeting of the Journey Group, noted apologies and then introductions were made.</p>
11:15	<p><b>2. Warm up</b></p> <p>The warm up activity linked each of the ten work groups to each of the twelve intentions.</p>
11:45	<p><b>3. What is the current care situation in Scotland: statistics</b></p> <p>The Scottish Government sponsor team presented the Children's Looked After Statistics (CLAS) and Scottish Children's Reporters Administration statistics. This was followed by a conversation about the lack of a comprehensive statistical understanding of the infants, children and young people in Scotland's 'care system' and the Care Review's commitment to meeting this.</p>

12:45	<p><b>4. Verbal update from each work group re progress so far in start-up stage</b></p> <p>A roundtable discussion took place with the co-chairs of each work group providing an update, how they are preparing for the first meeting of their respective work group what specific tasks they are undertaking:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>🏠 <b>Love:</b> considering what is meant by love and collating academic research;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Components of Care:</b> building principles and developing a work plan;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Workforce:</b> exploring the nine emerging themes to create a work plan;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Stop: Go; Test Pilot; Rocket Fuel:</b> planning to make these daily practice and to identify new ones;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Stigma:</b> considering where stigma sits, how to surface and tackle it;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Justice and Care:</b> considering good practice (UK / Europe), identifying stakeholders;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Health and Wellbeing:</b> considering what it is that makes an infant, child, young person healthy; and what 'wellbeing' means;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Best place in the world:</b> recognising that Scotland needs to be the best place in the world for <i>all</i> children to grow up;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Edges of Care:</b> planning to incorporate edges 'in' and edges 'out' ;</li> <li>🏠 <b>Rights:</b> considering the overall rights work plan especially re the UNCRC and the care system; and how to influence practice across Scotland.</li> </ul> <p>Fiona shared her Chair's report that highlights key activities she has carried out since the last meeting and discussed and agreed the best format of this for future Journey Group meetings.</p>

Presentation – what voices told the Care Review in Discovery</b></p> <p>Carly and Pat presented a snapshot of what was heard from all of the voices of care-experienced infants; children and young people during the Discovery stage.</p> <p>Fiona advised that there were, and continue to be, voice ‘targets’ to ensure diversity and representation.</p>

Update on workgroup members</b></p> <p>Fiona gave a detailed update on the planning work that had been carried out by the Secretariat Team to support the Journey work groups and to ensure a single programme of work and mitigate against the risk of the work groups becoming discrete areas of enquiry.</p> <p>A co-chairs Handbook had been circulated and this first draft was discussed with agreed updates.</p>
16:00	<p><b>7. Workgroup Terms of Reference update / 8. Outcomes for individual workgroups</b></p> <p>Thomas facilitated an exercise to consider “What next / Where do we want to be by September?” This was followed by a discussion about what would be delivered in advance of the September Journey meeting.</p>
